A Note from President Liz Sims

Since 2006, dedicated alumni, loyal friends, businesses, and community leaders have seen the desire of the Notasulga community to restore its historic Shiloh-Rosenwald School. They felt a need to improve this community, seek recognition for the men of the Tuskegee Syphilis study and their family members, and to ensure not only that America knew about this historic site, but also that our children can learn and appreciate their history right in their own community.

Our Annual Gala consists of dinner and an auction of unique historical items and memorabilia. Each year we hold our Annual Gala and Silent Auction to assist in raising funds needed to complete the restoration of the Shiloh-Rosenwald School. We have received generous grants for this project, and many parts of the school that were deteriorating and were in desperate need of repair were able to be restored. Now, we have a solid building that can be used for another hundred years.

When completed, the Shiloh-Rosenwald School will serve as a museum, a technology center, and a community center. It will hopefully be designated as a National Historic Site and receive National Landmark status, and will certainly serve as a reminder of our history and of the sacrifices that the men in the Tuskegee Syphilis study made for this community, county, and state.

We are preserving part of the legacy that began with the valiant efforts of Booker T. Washington and philanthropist Julius Rosenwald. Their project began in Macon County, Alabama and Notasulga in 1913 with the construction of six schools, and it resulted in the establishment of the Rosenwald Fund in 1917, which helped to construct 5,357 buildings and schools in fifteen southern states. We ask for your monetary support and your prayers as we work toward accomplishing the goals set forth for us. We hope to see you this year at our Fifth Annual Gala.
